

Condo challenge

A badge about

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**History:** Complete clause 1 and at least one other clause.

1. Find out from the 'Time Line' in Condo's room at Condurro:
  - a. What was Condurro before it became a Guide campsite?
  - b. Who was Condo and what was his job?
  - c. When did Lady Baden Powell visit Condurro and how many Guides welcomed her?
  - d. What did the girls do before toilets were installed?
  - e. What will the girls in the picture do with the apples they are picking?
  - f. When was electricity installed at Condurro?
2. Now draw a picture or make a list of all your answers and decorate it.

3. Spend 24 hours at Condurro without using electricity.
4. Pitch a traditional Ridge Tent and sleep in it or go inside and have a picnic.

**Apples:** Complete at least 2 clauses of your choice.

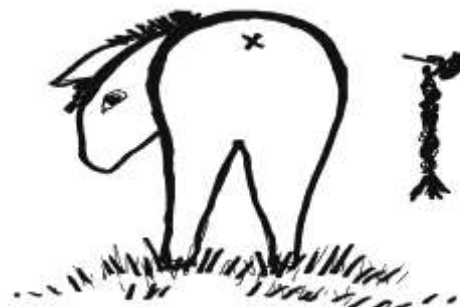
1. On a wood fire at Condurro, or when you get home, cook a dish using apples. Apples could be baked filled with sultanas, stewed, and served with custard or made into apple crumble, apple cake, muffins, or even jam as they did during the war!
2. Recognise 5 different types of apples. Taste them then see if you can tell the difference with your eyes shut.
3. Imagine what Condurro was like years ago by visiting an orchard to see different varieties of apples growing.

Take it further: Visit Trelissick Gardens, a National Trust garden near Truro. There you will find an orchard with lots of old varieties of apples, all named.

4. Try a game of apple bobbling.

**Donkeys:** Complete at least 2 clauses of your choice.

1. Find out something you didn't know about donkeys, and then tell your friends.
2. Play 'Pin the tail on the donkey'. Draw a large picture like our badge or just a picture of a donkeys bottom. Mark the spot where the tail should be. Now take turns blindfolded to be spun round, then with a string tail try to pin the tail in place. Nearest the spot wins!
3. Do a craft project with a donkey theme, you could use Fimo to make a fridge magnet, a picture using collage, a toy donkey using felt, or any other similar medium.
4. Say "Hello" to a real donkey.



Take it further:

1. You may know someone who has a donkey. Ask if you could visit.
2. Visit a donkey sanctuary e.g. The [Flika Foundation](#) or [The Tamar Valley Donkey Park](#)
3. Raise funds to adopt a donkey with the [New European Distressed Donkey Initiative Ltd.](#) (N.E.D.D.I)
4. Go to a nativity scene at Christmas where they have animals.

5. Sing the Condo song:
